
Ordeal Packing List

General:

- Medical Form (parts A & B)
- Medications

Friday Night:

- · Sleeping bag
- Ground cover (tarp)
- Bug spray
- Water bottle
- Pocket knife
- Rain gear/poncho




NOTE:

For Friday night you will be hiking to a designated sleeping area with your gear so we suggest that you follow the diagram above to create an easily carried "Horseshoe Roll". You should pack the rest of your gear for the weekend separate from your Friday night items as you will leave these items behind in camp for Friday night's activities.

Saturday:

- Work clothes
- Work gloves
- Class A Boy Scout uniforms (BSA Shirt & Pants)
- Cash for Trading Post (shirts, hats, patches, etc.)
- Other normal camping gear (toiletries, flashlight, change of clothes)



NOTE:

You will be able to change into work clothes and drop your Friday night gear off after breakfast on Saturday morning.

For Saturday night you can sleep in your own tent or use one of the camp's available lodges, tents or lean-to's.
